It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of our dear Bertie Mae Young on May 18th. She passed away peacefully at home at the age of 91. She was born in Utica, Mississippi, in 1932 to Jim N. and Bertie Ford Brown. She retired from AT&T after 35 years of service.

Bertie Mae will always be remembered for her kindness and generosity. In 2020, the Southern Christian Services for Children and Youth presented her with the Providence Award. She was a faithful member of the Episcopal Church and served many years as Treasurer for Saint Stephens and Holy Trinity Episcopal Church.

Bertie Mae's impact on the community is immeasurable. Her contributions to Copiah Academy, including a state-of-the-art science laboratory, have enriched the education of countless students. She was a dedicated member of the Copiah Educational Endowment Foundation and organized a beloved pumpkin painting event for the Dentville community. Her generosity knew no bounds.

There are many life-long accomplishments, such as serving as President of the AT&T Pioneers and serving as treasurer of the Cherokee Rose Chapter of the NSDAR (National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution). In addition to these outstanding accomplishments, Bertie Mae was treasurer

of the Dentville Community Swimming pool, member of the Utica 20th Century Club, and president and member of the Utica Cemetery board. She also received the Exceptional Recipient Award from the MAIS (Midsouth Association of Independent Schools).

Bertie Mae Young is preceded in death by her parents, Bertie Ford and Jim N. Brown, husband Robert P. Young, and niece Shanon Anderson.

She is survived by her brother, Jim N. Brown; Sister, Joree Anderson; nieces, Sharon Brown, Ashley Eisenhardt, Jodie Anderson and Myiah Anderson; and nephews, Jim H. Brown and Stephen Anderson. She is also survived by a special friend, Carol Rigby.
