Deborah Leigh Wallace was born on August 17, 1949 in Biloxi, Mississippi to Alvin and Chastine (Lowery) Wallace, her parents who she loved and adored. The oldest of three girls, she was a proud Air Force brat who grew up all over the world, spending the most time in Germany and Albuquerque, New Mexico. It was there that she met her best friend for life, and as young adults they had many adventures backpacking through Europe and living it up in New Mexico and California. She was an avid music fan throughout her life, especially of rock, soul, and R&B, and the live acts she was able to see during this time set the bar high. Her favorite bands were Earth, Wind, and Fire and the Average White Band, and she would never miss an opportunity to see either in person. She held many positions, from cocktail waitress at the Officer's Club on an Air Force Base in Germany, to cook on an oil rig in the North Sea, where she was introduced to Peter Puckett, who she would marry and share a daughter with. They settled in Georgetown, Mississippi where she was the beloved school secretary at Union Academy until the mid-nineties when she decided to go back to school for a nursing degree. She graduated from the University of Mississippi School of Nursing and went to work as a dedicated night nurse on the third floor of Blair E. Batson Children's Hospital, where she was loved by her patients and even was called an "angel". She cared for her patients deeply and spoke of them often for the rest of her days. In retirement, she enjoyed traveling with her sisters, going to the movies, doting on her four grandchildren, and doing exactly what she felt like doing when she felt like

doing it. She really loved to put a beach chair in the water on the beach in Destin and watch the kids splash in the waves and was always planning the next trip—even when she was too sick to travel. She passed away peacefully on the evening of May 14th, 2025 at her daughter's home in Bay St. Louis, where she had spent the last year battling an aggressive brain cancer. She was so loving, kind, smart, and generous, and is sorely missed by many, especially her daughter, sisters, and grandchildren.

Deborah Wallace Puckett is preceded in death by her parents, Alvin Lee and Johnnie Chastine (Lowery) Wallace, maternal grandparents John "Big" and Clara Lowery, and paternal grandparents Thomas and Betty Wallace.
